Opening Acclamation

Grace and peace to you from God; *God fill you with truth and joy.*

The Lord be with you; *the Lord bless you.*

This is the day which the Lord has made; *Let us rejoice and be glad in it.*

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden; cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, so that we may truly love you and worthily praise your holy name; through our Saviour, Jesus Christ. *Amen*

The Gloria (spoken)

Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth. Lord God, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. *Amen*

Hear the teaching of Christ; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. This is the first commandment. And a second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself; *Spirit of God, search our hearts.*

Hear the teaching of Christ; a new commandment I give to you, that you love one another as I have loved you.

Jesus said: There is joy among the angels of God over one sinner who repents. Come to me all who labour and are heavy laden and I will give you rest. God has promised forgiveness to all who truly repent, turn to Christ in faith and are themselves forgiving. In silence we call to mind our sins.

Silence

Let us confess our sins.

Merciful God, we have sinned in what we have thought and said, in the wrong we have done and in the good we have not done. We have sinned in ignorance; we have sinned in weakness; we have sinned through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry. We repent and turn to you. Forgive us, for our savior Christ's sake, and renew our lives to the glory of your name. Amen

Through the cross of Christ, God have mercy on you, pardon you and set you free. Know that you are forgiven and be at peace. God strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in life eternal.
Amen
